



1 Day : Kulen Mountain & Koh Ker

Start : 7am

Depart in the morning heading north towards Kulen Mountain an approximately a 1 ½ hour drive through Cambodian countryside in air-conditioned comfort. Enjoy the drive through scenic villages, verdant forests and climb into the mountains.

You will visit Cambodia's largest Reclining Buddha carved on sandstone. The temple is located on top of the high hill and can be reached through a step flight of steps. Next you will set off to the sacred river of 1000 Lingas. The riverbed is intricately carved with the phallic symbol of the Hindu god, Shiva.



You will also see rock carvings along the river depicting Hindu deities. Continue on through another sacred site, the Phnom Kulen Waterfalls. Calm your senses by watching the waterfall tumbling down the rocks. You will have time to wade in its basin and opt to cool-off from the midday sun by swimming in its clear waters.

Learn more about the historical and cultural significance of Phnom Kulen as your guide walks you through each of these landmarks.

Stop for lunch (at your own account) at a local restaurant along the way at the top of the waterfall.

Koh Ker is a remote archaeological site in northern Cambodia about 120 kilometres away from Siem Reap and the ancient site of Angkor.

It is a jungle filled region that is sparsely populated. More than 180 sanctuaries were found in a protected area of 81 square kilometres.

Only about two dozen monuments can be visited by tourists because most of the sanctuaries are hidden in the forest and the whole area is not fully demined. Return to Siem Reap.
